Conflict materials

At Möhlenhoff GmbH we take our responsibility as a company very seriously. It's the bedrock of our success. We want neither our own nor our suppliers' products to contain any conflict materials that come directly or indirectly from high-risk areas.

The EU's 2017/821 regulation on curbing trade in conflict minerals covers areas in a state of armed conflict or fragile post-conflict, as well as areas with weak or non-existent governance and security structures. Also affected are nations that systematically breach international law and violate human rights.

Conflict materials are gold, tantalum, tin and tungsten (commonly referred to as 3TG) and all other minerals defined as conflict materials in the current regulation.

In addition, we follow the requirements and guidelines on conflict minerals as specified in article 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Act, the US act on conflict materials.

To help us and our customers comply with the rules and regulations concerning conflict minerals, we expect our suppliers to apply due diligence along supply chains. If required, reports, documentation and written verifications must be presented. We pre-select suppliers carefully and expect feedback on the use of conflict minerals from all suppliers.

A current version of the RMI Conflict Minerals Reporting Template (CMRT) is to be used.
